
#### H3A IS LEARNING ALL ABOUT MAPS

In H3A we have been learning about maps and giving people directions to find things. This has been part of our integrated learning in Mathematics, HASS, Technology and Art. Our learning intention for this unit was: learning to give and follow directions to familiar locations and describe the position and movement of objects.

We started by creating maps of our hearts while we were learning from home. We thought about the things that are special to us and the amount of room they take up in our hearts. This activity incorporated aspects of our learning in HASS about special places and art.



Next we drew maps showing how to get to different places in our school. Then we went outside and followed them. This was an important step because we had to check that our maps were right and that we had included all the things we passed along the way.



We incorporated Technology into this unit, we used Bee Bots. These were fun because we got to push buttons to make them move around. We programmed them to follow a track. For some of us using the Bee Bots was easy while others of us had to be persistent to get it right.

The yummiest part of this Mathematics unit was eating the chocolate we found by following the directions our partner gave us. YUM! We learnt that we need maps and directions, so we know where we are going and how to get to different places.

#### **Performing Arts News**

This term in Performing Arts, we have been focussing on drama. The students have been having fun learning about the elements of drama – how to set the scene, get into character and perform to an audience.

F-2 students acted out fairy tales and Dreamtime stories and had a great time getting into character with costumes, games, puppets and props.

Years 3-5 made up their own plays using crazy scene cards, learnt about physical theatre through mime and machine techniques and have just started working on scripted plays.

Students in years 6/7 devised their own plays and are currently working on creating their own radio drama similar to those done in the 1930's.

Our Instrumental Program is ever increasing with well over 40 students involved each week. Singing lessons are now being offered at KFPS and this term, Pete our drum teacher began a drum line with over 20 students of all ages.



Marra Murrangga Kumangka means, "hands work together" in Kaurna language and this is the program's ethos. Together they have created something beautiful.






# Welcome to Australia
