# Site Improvement Plan

As a staff we have started analyzing our Naplan and Pat data to check how we are going with achieving the goals in our Site Improvement Plan.

We have found that;

- We have an improvement over time in our lower achievers in Maths but not enough growth in the High Bands.
- Achievement in Writing has improved but we still need to improve further.

After considering the data, we have decided to maintain our goals for Maths and Writing in our new Site Improvement Plan. Some real positives that we have noticed in writing include;

- Consistency of daily writing in Junior Primary classes
- Students are involved in setting writing goals
- The Seven Steps Writing Program is consistently implemented throughout the school
- Students are more engaged with writing and love to share their work
- Bump It Up Walls are used in some classrooms where students can clearly see what their next steps in writing are.

On our Pupil Free Day on Monday November the  $1^{st}$  staff will be involved with more data analysis and collaboratively planning our next steps to increase student achievement for all.
