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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

We are listening...

Children and young people learn every day, in every environment they are in. Parents are their children's first educators, and how parents support their children's learning matters. Schools provide the professional expertise and formal structure of education, and parents shape their children's values, attitudes and approaches to learning. Together, schools and parents provide the opportunities for children to thrive.

Our relationships with parents are at the centre of success for every child at school. We value your input and feedback and we do listen and take on board what you are saying.

Therefore we have amended our Hot Weather Policy and decreased the temperature for students staying inside to 36 degrees. This appears to be the temperature that the majority of schools use to enforce their Hot Weather Policy.

We have also decided to implement a ban on dogs coming onto our school grounds. For the safety and protection of students, the only dogs permitted on school grounds are; Toby our therapy dog, who has a risk assessment and been approved by Governing Council, and dogs brought in by a parent for class sharing with prior approval from the class teacher.

These decisions were made after a process of listening to parent feedback, Student Voice, staff discussion and Governing Council approval. More information about these policies were emailed on Wednesday 20th March.






