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FROM THE PRINCIPAL

We are constantly reminded in the media of the tragic consequences that bullying can have on our children. As a school we have decided to become pro-active in our approach to developing an anti-bullying culture in our school. The key is to catch bullying early and intervene.

In week 5 of every term, we will be conducting a bullying audit for Year 3-7 students and a well-being audit for R-2 students. The bullying audit allows students to identify; if they have been bullied this year, the frequency of bullying, the type of bullying and the name of the person bullying them. The audit also provides students with the opportunity to talk to either their teacher or leadership about any issues they may have. It gives students a voice.

The audits are then collected, collated and responded to. This term we have had a number of students who wanted to discuss issues, which has been done, and pleasingly, minimal students were identified as a bully. A meeting was organised for any students who were named as a bully 4 or more times with their parent, class teacher and a member of leadership.



The meeting is about helping students understand that their behaviour is viewed as bullying by some students. Sometimes students don't realise that what they are doing is bullying. It is also about working together to equip them with strategies to interact with others in positive ways.

We are teaching all of our students about RESPECT and that everyone has the right to be safe. Our aim is for Keithcot Farm Primary to truly be a school where all students feel safe, respected and heard.



H1B SCIENCE YEAR R/1

In Science we have been learning about the weather. We have looked at weather symbols. Symbols are marks or pictures that are used to represent ideas, warnings or messages instead of using writing. Then we made some of our own for our own weather reports. We have looked at temperature. Temperature is a measure of how hot or cold it is, it is how the weather and things 'feel'. We sorted some things based on their temperature and looked at the temperature of different kinds of air like the wind from fans we made, steam from a kettle and our breath. We also learnt about the seasons and made some weather pictures which are on display in the office.

TOILETS FACILITY UPDATE
