
What is Levelled Literacy Intervention or LLI?

Levelled Literacy Intervention (LLI) is a small group, supplementary intervention designed for students who find reading and writing difficult. LLI serves those students who do not qualify for one-on-one intervention but are still struggling to reach year level targets. Currently we provide small group LLI three times a week for 31 students from Years 1-6.



Some of the reasons why Keithcot Farm Primary School uses LLI are:

It is a researched and evidenced based program and is supplementary to the classroom literacy program. LLI lessons provide extra assistance three times a week with a home learning component. There are three to four students to a group. The group size ensures close observation and teaching interactions to promote individual learning for all students and to ensure literacy progress. There is a focus on comprehension with students reading several books every lesson and the facilitator providing comprehension support at the literal, inferential and critical level. Fluency is also an important goal. Lessons include a systematic focus on phonics, covering areas such as phonological awareness, letter knowledge, letter sound relationships, letter formation, word structure, spelling patterns and high frequency words.



QuickSmart Numeracy Intervention


QuickSmart Numeracy Intervention program is for students who will benefit from improving fast and accurate recall of basic number operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division who are in Years 4 and 5. Students complete 30-minute lessons, three times a week, over a period of 30 weeks. Students are chosen from the end of year PAT maths testing that all students complete.



Mathematics intervention sessions include: timed recall of basic number facts from a targeted set of focus number facts; speed sheets that also relate to the same set of focus facts and include extension number facts; opportunities to consolidate the use of strategies for calculating number facts; the use of a prompt scaffold to solve mathematical problems and establish knowledge of problem-solving routines; and regular testing on tasks from the CAAS bank of mathematical tasks.

We currently provide 12 students with this program. Quicksmart as our Maths Intervention program is currently under review. It is likely to change in 2019 to cater for more students across a wider range of maths skills.

These programs are coordinated by our Assistant Principals and run by trained SSOs. Families are consulted about their child's participation and provided with information about progress.

Thank you to the wonderful parents that have supported these teams and in particular our football coach, Clive Williams and Wendy Eddleston our netball coordinator.


Special mention must also go to our Auskick coordinator, Dylan, for coordinating our Centre this year.




