Teachers from year 3-5 have been attending training being run by Mathematics expert, Tierney Kennedy.

The training has focused around correcting student misconceptions and engaging all students with a problem solving approach.

Although the program is relatively new, we have seen Genius Hour affords students the opportunity to study some tremendous success in the participating classes what they are passionate about for an hour a week. It (between 2-5 years growth for some students and



program called Prodigy Maths. Prodigy Maths is an engaging program that requires maths fluency and problem solving in order to progress through its levels. It has been adopted by many classrooms as part of their homework routine or implemented as part of a balanced maths program.

Teachers can see what problems students are attempting and what they need support with. In addition to tracking their personal achievement (aligned with the national curriculum), it also allows teachers to set assignments and focus on topics they are studying at school.

Science Technology Engineering Maths

In Terms 2 and 3 in STEM, students have learnt to build and program the Riley Robots using algorithms to program simple movements (forward, back, left and right), then add sensors to provide the robot with information from the surrounding environment (Ultra-Sonic for distance, Colour/Light, Touch and Gyro/ Sound Sensors). Students work in groups to support and learn from each other and then document their progress while having a fun time learning.



P2A and P2B have done some fantastic writing and drawing for about Taikoz.





