






### **SPORTS DAY 2018**



Motocross is a dangerous sport and wearing the right safety gear is very Hayden does not ride his bike unless he is wearing all his safety gear including helmet, boots, neck brace, chest plate, knee and elbow pads and riding pants. Like any other sport Hayden has coaches to assist him improve his skills and ensure he is using the correct riding technique. Motocross is huge commitment for the whole family. Hayden's dad spends countless hours maintaining his bike and the family travels around the state for races from places such as Keith, Renmark and Port Lincoln. Race days can sometimes take as long as 10 hours and like any sport needs lots of volunteers to ensure the races run smoothly. Hayden also has some sponsors who assist with the cost of his bike parts, safety gear and mechanic work. Although Motocross is an individual sport Hayden has made some great friends along the way. This year Hayden finished 3rd in the South Australian State titles and was selected on the state team to represent SA at the Junior Motocross nationals in Tasmania.


