
















## Congratulations to our Volunteers of the Year

We thank you both for your commitment to the KFPS Community during 2018.


#### **Volunteer Morning Tea**

On Tuesday the 27th of November the staff provided a thank you morning tea for all our wonderful volunteers who have done an amazing job assisting us throughout 2018.




#### JAPANESE CHARACTER RECOGNITION

#### **Christmas On The Hill**


