UNIFORM UPDATE

We wish to advise that we are making some changes to our uniform in 2024.

After listening to feedback from our parent community regarding price, quality and availability we have spent some time looking at different options that will suit the needs of our community better.

In consultation with our Governing Council we have looked at alternate uniform where samples were provided that will be longer lasting and higher quality with better pricing.

As a result, we will finish with School Locker at the end of February 2024 and move to Devon Clothing from March 2024.

While going through this process Governing Council also agreed to changing our logo design. We felt it was time to modernise the current logo while keeping the original house design. All uniform manufactured by Devon Clothing will have the new logo (including the 2024-year 6 cohort)

Devon will take over the sale of all current style uniform from March 2024 that will be fazed out over a transition period and once the current style is utilised they will start manufacturing stock with the updated logo.








Around The Grounds


